Malaysia ranked 19th most globalised country

KUALA LUMPUR: Malaysia's strong linkages with the global economy has earned it top marks among the most globalised countries.

International Trade and Industry Minister Datuk Seri Rafidah Aziz said Malaysia was ranked the 19th most globalised country based on A.T. Kearney's Globalisation Index 2006.

"Malaysia was one of the two countries in Asia to be placed in the top 20, including the US, Canada and New Zealand," she said at the Industry Excellence Awards 2006.

Rafidah also said while Malaysia's globalisation index was encouraging, the country should not be complacent.

"This is because other economies such as India and China are undertaking structural reform to enhance their competitiveness," she said,
